Changes in Alert Procedures

ACBL has revised the Alert Procedures effective January 1, 2021.

An article highlighting the changes appears in the January issue of the ACBL Bulletin. The Alert Procedures is a 13-page document that supports the more familiar Alert chart. The Alert chart has not yet been updated.



For most players, the change you will encounter first relates to transfers. Instead of alerting *transfer*, the announcement now is the suit being shown by the transfer bid. So, after 1NT, a response of 2D is announced as *hearts* while a response of 2H would be announced as *spades*. The 1NT opening range should also be announced.



When playing face-to-face bridge, the partner of the bidder makes the announcement. Playing online, the bidder makes the announcement using the alert function in the bidding box.

For those playing a short club opener, the announcement is now *could be two* or *could be one*, depending on the minimum number of clubs shown.

Support doubles and redoubles no longer require an Alert.

Note: Those who play a system with an artificial one-level opening bid that is forcing are now required to **pre-alert at the start of the round**.

You are encouraged to become familiar with the alert requirements for conventions that you play. While there is no automatic penalty for a failure to alert, score adjustments are possible if the opponents are damaged.

Peter's Lesson



Hello Tuesday and Wednesday folks!

Lesson: What is the *Rule of 16* after partner opens 1 no trump?

Your partner opens 1 no trump with 15 to 17 points.

You wonder whether you have enough points to raise partner to 3 no trump. To help you decide you might want to apply the *Rule of 16*. Let's take a look.



You have **8 high card** points – hmmm... difficult decision.

- Ask yourself How many cards 8 and above do I have in my hand? In this case you have 9 cards.
- Add this number to your high card points.
 (points) plus 9 (cards 8 and above) = 17
- > These two numbers add up to 16 or more.
- ➤ If they do, you should consider bidding 3 no trump.
